Who are we?

We are a private day nursery based right in the heart of Horsforth, conveniently close to the A65, the Leeds Ring Road and The Froebelian School. We welcome applications from all children aged 3 months to 5 years.

We are open from 7.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday, 51 weeks of the year.

The nursery ethos is driven by Miss Burton who is very experienced in the early years sector, including time as a fully qualified teacher and an Ofsted inspector. This, along with the support from the highly renowned Fraebelian School, sets our nursery apart from the rest.



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Our philosophy — what we do It is the nursery's aspiration to uphold The Froebelian School's aims and traditions of **"giving a flying start to the citizens of tomorrow"**.

Our mission is all about inspiring and enabling young children to reach their true potential through education and play. We still follow some of the concepts of Freidrich Freebel the German educator, who created the concept of kindergaten and from whom the school and nursery take their name. His theories were all gained from viewing life through a child's eye and the idea of "creative play", something which we still aim to do.

We have a distinct educational philosophy, which sets us apart from many other nurseries. But where we differ, is that we subtly blend play and fun with process based learning.

Many of our activities are designed to create opportunities and invitations to kern, both in individual and group situations. It is our intention to ensure that children leaving First Steps have been nurtured to give them a confident head start at school, whether it be at Froebelian or elsewhere.



Learning in the Babyrooms

As well as learning through active play, much of our under-2s' learning stems from their drive to investigate their surroundings with all their senses. This includes fun with water, sand and other malleable materials. Floor eases support early mark-making and finger painting, which are large-mator and sensory experiences at this age.

Block play is important for young children's cognitive development. Their minds start to process concepts like gravity, shape and symmetry years before they learn such terms.

Treasure baskets nurture curiosity and learning. The sort of manipulative actions typically seen during treasure basket play may be linked to a complex process of rule acquisition, categorisation and developing mental files rather than simply exploration per se.

Heuristic play too is based on natural curiosity (heuristic means 'to find out'). As babies grow, they move beyond just feeling and pondering things, to wanting to find out what can be done with them!

Toddlers have an urge to manipulate objects and use them in combination, so practitioners collect a large supply of tins and lots of natural and found items for them to explore.

Because these materials are free of detail, children's imaginations flourish. A child using a cardboard tube as trumpet, for instance, is demonstrating an active imagination. Einstein said 'Imagination is more important than knowledge'. Not only does imagination add a rich dimension to children's lives, it is also key to understanding the feelings of others.

A babyroom wouldn't be quite right without an abundance of nussery thymes and singing. Whether in groups or during routines such as nappy changing we embrace every opportunity to develop our thythm and vocabulary through a good song.

Movement

Children need to move. Body and brain develop together, and physical development occurs through using the body, moving it in space and gravity.

We understand the importance of physical activity and have the space and resources to allow this to be realised.

Curiosity

Children are naturally eager to learn about the world and everything in it.

When their interest is engaged, they push the boundaries of their knowledge, hungry for more. We tune in to each individual child's curiosity and nutture it.

Imagination

Imagination's significance cannot be overstated as children are the world's future inventors, scientists, writers, thinkers and leaders.

Imagination enables "possibility thinking" which is essential for innovation. It opens new realms and is actively encouraged and facilitated at First Steps.

Creativity

Creativity is central to a child's approach to life and learning. We make sure children have the freedom to experiment boldly, nurturing their confidence to create.

Hands-on experience

We find hands on experience is a great way to learn.

Whether imparting maths through cookery – or counting through music and play we find we are rewarded by the children's enthusiasm.

Play

Play is a child's chief mode of developing a disposition for learning. It is how they most readily formulate and communicate ideas.

A large part of the day is devoted to play as a vehicle for ensuring their education and their development. Play builds language skills as children share ideas, plan, discuss and negotiate.

Children's capacity for learning is boundless when you inspire their imagination.





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Healthy diet, happy child

Offering a varied diet encourages children to experience and enjoy new flavours and textures, giving them the confidence they need to try new things.

Healthy eating is not just about what we put on the plate. We believe it is about educating children and giving them the knowledge and independence to make healthy choices that will set them up for their future.

All meals at First Steps are designed specifically to meet the nutritional needs of children under the age of five years.

Breakfast is a choice of cereals, taast and fruit. Lunch is a well-balanced, nutritious hat meal, with a vegetarian choice and a pudding. Tea is a high tea, which provides children with a light snack.

Meal times are a very special teaching and social time. A family atmosphere prevails, where table manners and etiquette are paramount. All children share a snack of fresh fruit and milk, throughout the day. Water is always available and children are encouraged to drink regularly.
