Froebelian Pupil Ranked First!

A Form IV pupil is celebrating having been ranked first place in the recent entrance exam for The Crossley Heath School in Halifax.

The test, taken by hundreds of entrants for one of 360 places available, comprised three parts: English, Mathematics and Verbal Reasoning over a total of 2 hours. Headteacher Catherine Dodds said: "We are so incredibly proud. He is an outstanding pupil who has developed a solid range of learning skills and attitudes which have served him well in his assessments. We are confident that he will continue to thrive when he reaches senior school, after his flying start at Froebelian."

Books to Malawi

When we realised we had a cupboard full of books that the school no longer needed, Mrs Miller suggested that we send them to help children in Malawi.

So we did! Mr Barry Brindley from The Zikomo Trust came and collected a whole selection of books for children of all Primary school ages. The Zikomo Trust supports orphans, vulnerable children and the elderly in Malawi through education, community support and healthcare. Twice a year the trust sends out a container with educational materials, sports equipment and books for distribution to the primary and secondary schools up and down the country. In 2016 they donated educational items to seven primary schools, six secondary schools, a school for the blind, the University of Malawi and a medical college.

Miss Hoe opened the doors of The Froebelian School in 1913 at 11 Riseholme Terrace (known today as 59 New Road Side) for just 10 pupils. This was no mean feat, as her relation Valery Dyas said: "A girl born into her situation would have had ahead of her usual prospect – marriage motherhood. However, Mary wanted more from life."
