Form III thoroughly enjoyed their Macbeth workshop on Thursday. They embraced the literary world of Shakespeare with enthusiasm and complete engagement. Thank you to the fabulous Young Shakespeare Company for entertaining us.

In Maths, we looked at multi-step problems. The children worked on a variety of maths questions involving more than one calculation. Some of the questions were challenging indeed. During our starters, we have revisited key skills such as: inverse, Roman Numerals, place value as well as finding fractions of amounts.

In our English lessons, we completed a comprehension, which focused on the skills of prediction using evidence from the text and continued our work on relative pronouns and therefore relative clauses. See my quick definition of both in last week's newsletter. We also revisited speech marks and the rules for using these punctuation marks in our writing.

In our Science lesson, we finished our Forces topic and completed a mind map to help us recall all the learning from this huge subject. This was a useful revision exercise.

In History, the children have been looking at William the Conqueror's invasion of England. We looked at the Battle of Stamford Bridge in 1066 and how this affected the outcome of the Battle of Hastings. We also learnt what happened during the Battle of Hastings. The children decided which claimant they thought had the advantage in both battles.

In RE, we continued to look at the story of Ruth and Naomi, and thought about the messages that this story contains.

Our recommended read for this week is: 'Percy Jackson and the Last Olympian' by Rick Riordan. This is an apt recommendation as a new film is about to land on Disney + just before Christmas plus Krish is enjoying this series of books at the moment. 'The Percy Jackson series is a deserved bestseller as it's a clever and brilliantly crafted fusion of the worlds of gods and humans. Schoolboy Percy, son of Poseidon, knows from the prophecies that bad things will happen when he turns sixteen, but even he doesn't know how bad those things might be! Now Percy must face down Kronos, Lord of the Titans, who has gone on the rampage and threatens to storm Mount Olympus. The clash of cultures and the clash of might, makes this a thrilling adventure.'
